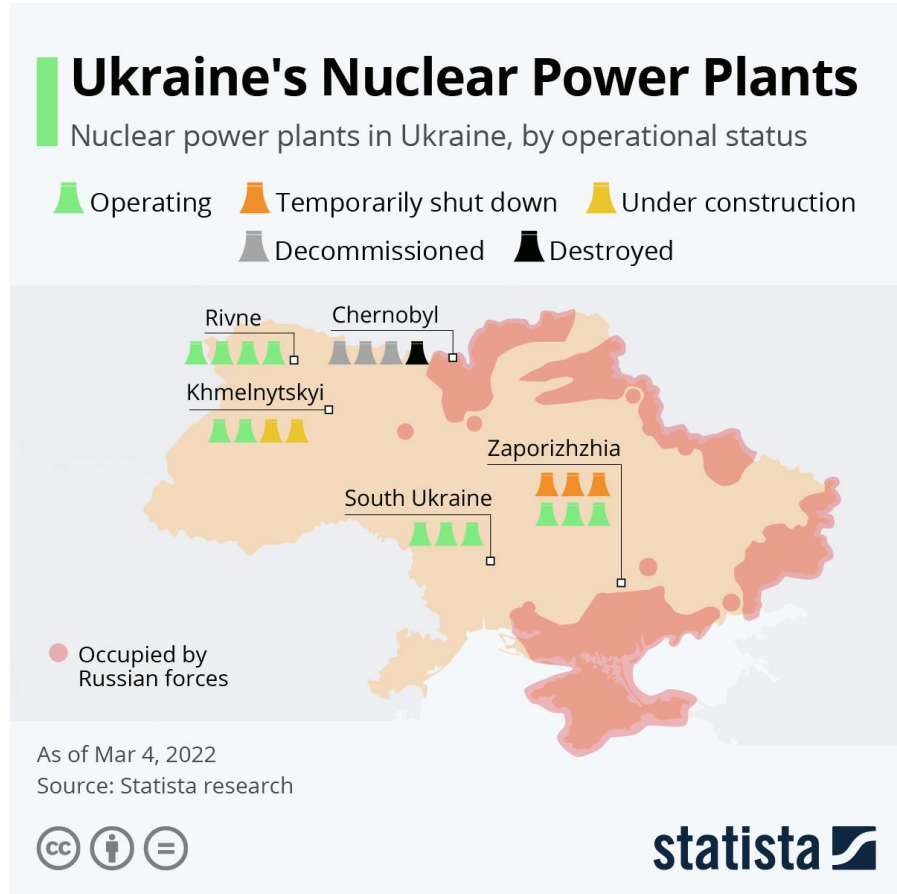
Russia seizes Europe's largest nuclear plant

1. Russian forces seized the largest nuclear power plant **Zaporizhzhia** in Europe after a building at the complex was set ablaze during intense fighting with Ukrainian defenders, Ukrainian authorities said.

2. Fears of a potential nuclear disaster at the **Zaporizhzhia** plant had

spread alarm across world capitals before authorities said the fire in a building identified as a training centre, had been extinguished.

3. Russia had already captured the defunct **Chernobyl** plant north of Kyiv, which spewed radioactive waste over much of Europe when it melted down in 1986. The Zaporizhzhia plant is a different and safer type, analysts said.
